AND WHEREAS the key components of an asset management plan as required by the regulation are:

- 1. Infrastructure asset inventory
- 2. Levels of service
- 3. Lifecycle management and financial strategy

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AND WHEREAS there is concern amongst Municipal Finance Offers' Association of Ontario (MFOA) members and their municipalities that current capacity challenges (redeployment of staff, and lack of available resources) will result in limitations for purposeful asset management planning;

AND WHEREAS Ontario municipalities do not anticipate the current capacity challenges to be resolved in the short-term;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE TOWNSHIP OF HARLEY supports MFOA's letter to the Ministry of Infrastructure requesting a one-year extension of deadlines in O.Reg. 588/17: Asset Management Planning for Municipal Infrastructure under the Infrastructure for Jobs and Prosperity Act, 2015; so that all municipalities can focus on the immediate needs of the pandemic and engage in municipal asset management planning when capacity challenges are resolved.
